FAQs

1. Are the applications available in word format?

Yes. Please email thelibrarypresnts@cambridgeshire.gov.uk to request.

2. Can I submit more than one idea?

Yes. The maximum from any artist/organisation is three.

3. If I produce content for TLP will I be allowed to share / use it elsewhere?

For the small brief –

Yes. Please acknowledge The Library Presents when it is used.

Our main aim is to provide content for The Library Presents and/or Cambridgeshire residents to help engage our current audiences but there is no reason that content couldn't be shared more widely (in fact we are hoping to collaborate with national and regional bodies to share content).

The medium scale projects will be interactive and will focus on Cambridgeshire residents (or specific groups of people) as the target/user group. If appropriate, and without diminishing the offer to residents, content can be shared elsewhere.

4. I have already started developing digital content. Can I still apply?

Yes. We cannot retrospectively fund any content that has already been posted on line but we can support future 'episodes' so that you can develop your ideas, introduce interactive elements and ensure that they are of high quality.

5. If I am offering visual art / craft activities do they need to be things people can do at home without going out to buy resources?

Yes. We would like the content to be accessible to all so this will require an element of improvising and creative problem solving with regard to resources, and "going out to buy" isn't an option.

6. Can I use the funding to buy / hire equipment to ensure my filming is of high quality?

We are not ruling this out. If essential please include in your costs. However, this would reduce the amount available to you for production of content.

We are anticipating that content may be produced on a smart phone. If this is the case we would expect the filming to be kept still (ideally using a tripod) that it is in focus, with good lighting and that efforts have been taken to remove background noise and ensure clear audio.
